planned, including: pickleball, mixed media art workshop, dance workshops and a fun and interactive Improv session.

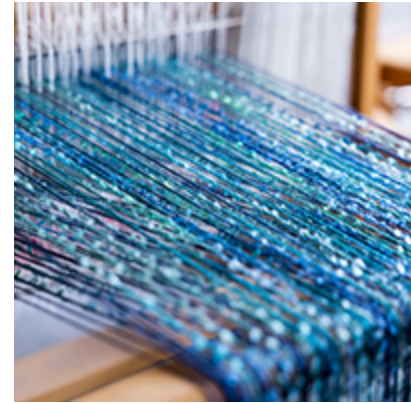

Steveston Farmers and Artisans Market (SFAM)

Located next to the Steveston Community Centre at 4111 Moncton Street, the Steveston Farmers & Artisans Market is open 10:30am to 3:30pm: May 7 and 21; June 4 and 18; July 6 and 30; August 6 and 20; and September 3 and 17.

Enjoy lively entertainment, fresh produce and unique products offered in a festive, open-air environment. The market is a non-profit operation run by a volunteer committee. All monies raised support activities and projects of the Steveston Community Centre.

Kwantlen St. Farmers Market

This market is open Tuesdays, May 16 to November 14 from 12:00 to 4:00pm at the Minoru Plaza. Find fresh, delicious local gourmet foods, sample small-batch craft brewed beers, ciders and wines and browse unique gifts designed by artists from across the province, all the while enjoying live music.

Hamilton Pop-Up Market
