OPPORTUNITY

The City of Richmond Public Art Program seeks proposals from artists for the 2027–2028 No.3 Road Art Columns Program. Two 6-month exhibitions will run from February 1 to July 21, 2027 and August 1, 2027 to January 31, 2028. Each exhibition will showcase three (3) artists.

Six (6) commissioned artists will each receive an artist fee of \$1,500 for four (4) print-ready digital artwork files. Printing and installation costs will be the responsibility of the City of Richmond. Artists with practices in mixed-media, painting, illustration, photography, printmaking, drawing and other mediums suitable for digital reproduction are encouraged to apply.

BACKGROUND

The No. 3 Road Art Columns provide a unique opportunity for public art in Richmond. These backlit display cases allow the Richmond Public Art Program to showcase two-dimensional artworks in prominent locations at Aberdeen and Lansdowne Canada Line Stations. The Art Columns are part of the City's commitment to enhance the No.3 Road streetscape and showcase local artists.

Artists applying for this opportunity are encouraged to visit the Art Columns located at Aberdeen and Lansdowne Canada Line Stations. Each one consists of four backlit panels located at the base of a concrete column supporting the Canada Line. There are three Art Columns in total: two located at Lansdowne Station and one at Aberdeen Station.

ARTIST OPPORTUNITY

These exhibitions invite local artists to submit work that celebrates Richmond's culture, history and natural heritage.

The display cases have an internal backlit casing, so that the artworks are especially vibrant and visible at night. **Artists are encouraged to submit artwork with bold colour palettes and minimal areas of solid colour to deter graffiti.** Strong contrasting colour palettes will also work to maximize the presence and presentation of the artwork during the daytime. The size of the display case visual opening is 70" wide x 66.5" high. The overall size of the printed art panel is 76" wide x 72.5" high.

Corporate trademarked logos, brands, wordmarks, religious or political iconography and/or offensive language will not be reproduced or shown as part of the artwork.

BUDGET

Each selected artist will receive an artist fee of \$1,500 for four (4) print-ready digital artwork files. Selected artists will be required to document their artwork in a digital format for printing, if required. Additional fees for digitization may apply at the artist's expense. Printing and installation costs will be the responsibility of the City of Richmond.

ARTIST ELIGIBILITY

This opportunity is open to visual artists who reside in Richmond. City of Richmond employees, Richmond Public Art Advisory Members and artists who are currently contracted by the City of Richmond are not eligible to apply.

Artists must be available to work with the City between November 2026 – February 2027 and June – August 2027. This will include finalizing artwork, preparing print files, coordinating with the City's printing and installation contractor and preparing artwork statements.

SELECTION PROCESS

A three-person selection panel consisting of professional artists, art professionals and community members will engage in a one-stage artist selection process. At the conclusion of the process, the panel will recommend six (6) artists for the commissions. The selected artists will enter into contracts with the City of Richmond.

ARTIST SELECTION CRITERIA

Submissions to the Call will be reviewed and decisions made based on:

- artistic merit of artist's response to the artist opportunity and how the opportunity will inform the artist's practice; and
- artist's capacity to respond to the Public Art Program goals:

- **INFORMATION FORM** – Please complete the information form on the last page of this document.
- **ARTWORK STATEMENT** – 300 words (max.), a brief bio of the artist and how the proposed artworks respond to the Artist Opportunity: *for work that celebrates Richmond's local culture, history and natural heritage*.
- **PROPOSED ARTWORK** – Submit four (4) low-resolution digital images of the proposed artworks. Only selected artists will be required to submit high-resolution print-ready digital image files. Please include artist name, title, year and medium information as captions on each image page. If selected, release forms must be obtained by the artist from any person(s) depicted or represented in selected artworks for the exhibition.
- **ARTIST CV** – Two (2) pages maximum, including relevant education, training, mentorships, artist residencies and exhibition record.
