

Taking Care of Our Feathered Friends

Protecting nests

As spring arrives, our feathered friends are getting ready to nest! Many bird species in Richmond maintain their nests from the beginning of March to late August. Nests are not just found in tree - numerous birds nest in gravel, ground vegetation, shrubs and streambanks. Are you planning a garden refresh or tree trimming? Before you start, look for any bird activities. If you see a nest please keep your distance and do not disturb it. Let's do what we can to give birds and their young space to grow! The provincial Wildlife Act and federal Migratory Birds Convention Act protect most birds, eggs and nests. Some nests like those of the great blue heron and bald eagle are protected year-round.

We are quintupling the output of the City's public charging network to power electric vehicles quickly, meaning less waiting, more driving and a cleaner future.


Driving Change
