

Frequently Asked Questions 2024/2025 Snow Angels Program

1. What is the Snow Angels Program?

As the winter months approach, heavy snowfall can cause challenges for some residents – particularly elderly citizens and residents with illnesses, disabilities or mobility challenges. Richmond's Snow Angels Program offer *voluntary* assistance to these community members.

2. Who are Snow Angels?

Snow Angels are volunteers in their own geographic community who are organized by the City of Richmond. The City is responsible for volunteer screening, training and dispatching in the event of a winter storm.

3. Who is eligible for assistance through the Snow Angels program?

The Snow Angels program is intended to assist the elderly and residents with physical disabilities or mobility challenges. Richmond residents must be 65+ years or have a physical disability and live in a single dwelling or semi-detached house, with a private driveway. Recipients must be unable to shovel snow, not have family/friends in the area to help them or don't have the means to pay for a snow removal service.

4. Is snow removal guaranteed?

No. The program relies on volunteers whose safety and ability is unique to each individual, and varies during the snow season. If guaranteed snow removal is required, contact a local snow removal service provider.

5. Which type of service is performed by Snow Angels?

Snow Angels provide snow removal assistance to create a pathway leading to front doors and on sidewalks in front of residences. **Snow Angels DO NOT shovel driveways.**

6. How much snowfall is required for the Snow Angels program to be activated?

The City is informing residents that Snow Angels can be contacted in the event of any significant snowfall with an accumulation of **3+ cm** of snow for more than 8 hours.

7. Are Snow Angels expected to provide services across the city?

Snow Angels may select the geographic community or communities they wish to serve or they may choose to provide services citywide. The City aims to pair up volunteers with the nearest resident in need.

8. Are volunteers able to participate in the Snow Angels program as individuals?

10. What is the registration window for eligible residents?

Residents must register between November 1 and December 1. All residents who register after December 1 will be placed on a waitlist.

11. Do residents have to register every year?

Yes. The Snow Angel registry resets every year and residents are required to register during the registration window if they would like to receive assistance.
