Interview at 914 Dublin St., New Westminster with Mrs. Walter (Maggi)
Lee, sister-in-law of pioneer Charles Ernest London and another
daughter of London, Mrs. Mary Margaret Mack. (Roy)

Mrs. Lee, 90 years, born July 8, 1882, Dalbete, Scotland, came to Lulu Island at 7 years, landed from New Westminster on old "Edgar" with mother, brother, walked 2 miles to school from original Gilmore farm (Mother remarried) - not steady to school, married Lee at 23 - to prairies, Edmonton, embroidery, knitting - Vancouver. Presented 100th year medal from Richmond. Made rose beads. Indians had war dances canneries had houses - smoked fish.

Mrs. Mary Margaret Mack born in 2nd London farmhouse (picture in Mus eum) May 8, 1901 - younger sister Mrs. Herbert (Lucy) Howse, older brothers Edwin, Louie - youngest sister Florence Henrietta - other brothers George, Willie, Ernest died as babies - just wonderful growing up on farm - simple pleasures - ride work horses when home for meals at noon - walked a lot to school - Steveston 25 miles - Dad very kind - if rained hard met with horses - walked, drove horse and buggy "down the dyke" - busy on farm holidays - went to Kitsilano - lots to do - made home made ice cream - churned butter - raspberries, loganberries, blackberries, spread on farm - salted pork, fish - store of Dad and his brother down at end of No. 2 Road - later own wharf near home - left farm when father sold it - worked Telephone Co. in Vancouver 5 years and married 1929 - lived Brittania Beach - then New Westminster where husband's family old timers.

Father communicated in Chinook - Chinese man worked on Dad's farm - Ed (oldest brother) learned Chinese from him - waterfowl caught - roas ts 50¢ to \$1.00 - to cannery get fish to salt - made sauerkraut - gather eggs.
