What is Block Watch?

Block Watch is a free, community-based, crime prevention program aimed at encouraging and helping residents organize and take a proactive approach to crime prevention. Through support and training, Block Watch provides information and resources for the community to reduce the opportunity for people to commit crime in their neighbourhoods.

How does it work?

Block Watch works if neighbours get to know one another, they may be the first to notice a suspicious person and to call the Police. A police officer patrolling your community may not recognize a stranger in your yard – but your neighbour will.

When neighbours work together, they can prevent crime in their neighbourhood the most effective way – before it happens.
