The Kaiwo Maru, meaning "King of the Sea," is one of the largest and most renowned tall ships in the world. A limited number of tickets are available for nautical enthusiasts to board and explore the vessel.

There will also be live performances, a Kid's Cove and the Sails in the Sky field, which will host both kite professionals and local enthusiasts.

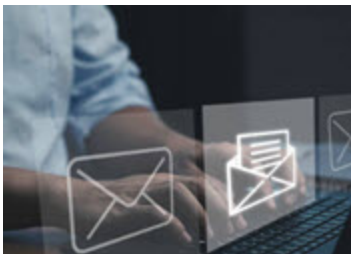
