Works Yard replacement update

Council approved the Phase 1 form and character design for the Works Yard Replacement Project on Mon, May 11, along with the proposed facility name, "City of Richmond Works Yard." This supports a safe, prepared community through post-disaster construction, flood-resilient operations, and a layout that maintains service continuity during redevelopment. This approval allows staff to move forward with detailed design and advance Phase 1 toward construction.
