## **Protecting Sea Level Rise**

The Sturgeon Bank Sediment Enhancement Pilot project restores marsh and enhances coastal resilience against sea-level rise by relocating reclaimed sediment dredged from the Fraser River onto the Sturgeon Bank foreshore. The Department of Fisheries and Oceans has announced two more years of funding. Year three of the pilot is scheduled for fall of 2024.

# 2024 City Nature Challenge

#### **Post Competition Results**

The City of Richmond in collaboration with Richmond School District 38 participated in the fifth annual City Nature Challenge from April 26th to April 29th. Richmond came in 13th place within Canada and 227th out of a total of 690 participating cities from around the world.

This year, we had 44 participants with 1792 observations of 448 different species. Way to go Richmond!

# **Elevating Access**

#### **New River Road Pedestrian Stairway**

The City of Richmond is building a new pedestrian stairway and crosswalk at the intersection of River Road and Gibbons Drive. The project is set to be completed by Fall 2024. Richmond boasts one of British Columbia's most comprehensive flood protection systems and allows for incredible access to the waterfront. The design of the new stairway aligns with broader dike upgrades that prioritize pedestrian safety, active transportation, wellness and access to nature. Features include:

- durable wooden staircase
- improved street lighting for better visibility
- new signage, and clear road markings
- an asphalt pedestrian landing for additional stability.

The stairway construction will mirror elements of a completed stairway at the intersection of River Road and Lynas Lane. Until completion, the City encourages residents to use other designated safe access points located at McCallan, No. 1 Road, or Lynas Lane.

# **Switch to a Heat Pump**

#### **Get Rebates**

The Federal and Provincial governments announced an expansion of rebates for low- and middle-income British Columbian's to switch to a heat pump.

Those who qualify for a new heat pump could see an increase in support of approximately 70% from B.C.'s existing rebate program from between \$9,500 to \$16,000.

In addition, the City is providing top-ups for Richmond residents insalling heat pumps in their home.
