A Remembrance Day ceremony will be held on Tue, Nov 11 at City Hall for those wishing to reflect and commemorate with the community in person. The parade begins at 10:20am, followed by official ceremonies at 10:40am at the cenotaph.

After the ceremony, you can cross the <u>commemorative crosswalk</u> at No. 3 Road and Anderson Road, which honours local Veterans and their contributions to Canada. The crosswalk stands as a visible and permanent symbol of remembrance, created through community consultation and collaboration.

For those unable to attend in person, Richmond's Remembrance Day service will also be available online, ensuring everyone has the opportunity to honour and remember.
