A Day to Remember

Saturday, November 11

Honour and remember Canadian service personnel who gave their lives in the service of our country. Come join the Remembrance Day Ceremony on Saturday, November 11, at the cenotaph located on the east side of Richmond City Hall. The official ceremony will begin at 10:40am with two minutes of silence at 11:00am, followed by wreath laying. Due to the solemn nature of the Remembrance Day Ceremony, pets are asked to be left at home.

Immediately following the ceremony will be the Remembrance Day Reception in the City Hall Atrium, offering people a space to warm up with a hot drink and something sweet, talk about Remembrance Day and connect with other community members. A number of Remembrance Day displays by the Richmond Museum, the City of Richmond Archives and the Friends of the Richmond Archives will also be available to view.

For those unable to attend in person, Richmond's Remembrance Day service will be recorded and streamed live. Watch the event starting at 10:20am on Saturday, November 11. The recording will also be available to view in its entirety following the ceremony.
