**October 19-27, 10:00am-4:00pm**

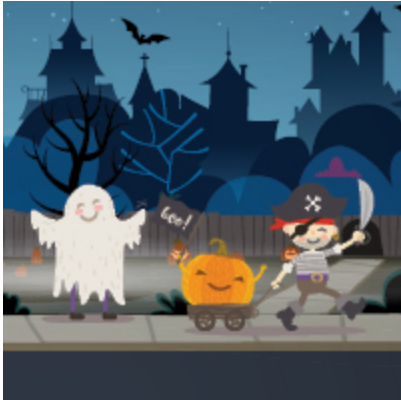

## Safety

The City of Richmond, the Richmond Fire-Rescue and the RCMP are reminding residents that it is illegal to possess, buy, sell or detonate fireworks and firecrackers in the City without a permit.

Under Richmond’s Fire Protection and Life Safety Bylaw 8306, offences and fines include:

- Purchasing fireworks (\$1,000 fine)
- Displaying fireworks for sale (\$1,000 fine)
- Selling or distributing fireworks (\$1,000 fine)
- Ignition of fireworks without a permit (\$400 fine)

Richmond Fire-Rescue along with City Bylaw Enforcement staff and the RCMP will be actively patrolling the community to watch for illegal

use of fireworks and other safety issues to ensure the public is safe during the upcoming festival times. Staff and emergency personnel are asking for support from the community to keep people safe and enjoyable for everyone.
