Up to \$2,500 is accessible for non-profit organizations, and up to \$500 for individuals, from across Metro Vancouver to take positive action on Richmond's environment. Examples of initiatives include invasive species pulls, shoreline or street clean-ups, wildlife education and more. Applications for the 2025 Environmental Enhancement Grants open September 2024.
